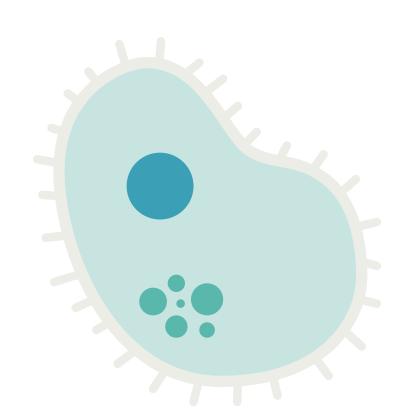

STRESS EXPERIENCED DURING THE COVID-19 PANDEMIC

In secondary three (9th grade) and four (10th grade) adolescents who participated in the study between May 1st and June 30^{th} , 2020
